# US' Role in Educating International Students


- ▶ “The United States continues to host more international students than any other country in the world,” said Allan Goodman, President and CEO of the IIE.







# International Students' Contribution to the U.S. Economy

- ▶ \$20 billion, through their expenditures on tuition, living expenses including room and board, books, supplies, transportation, health insurance, support for accompanying family members, etc. (US Department of Commerce)
  - ▶ Almost 70% of all international students' primary funding comes from sources outside of the U.S. (Open Doors 2010 Report)

# In China Part 1 of 2

- ▶ Elementary to junior high education is mandatory.
  - ▶ Education as an investment.
  - ▶ Generous and open US visa policy lured more students to America, both undergraduate and graduate schools.
  - ▶ 350,000 eligible high school graduates in 2010 did not take the national college entrance examination among whom 250,000 are here.

# In China Part 2 of 2

- ▶ Based on the Chinese statistics, 50,000 households had assets over \$500M last year.
  - ▶ In 2006, 310,000 households owned assets over \$1 M.
  - ▶ By 2011, it is projected 609,000 households will have assets over \$1M.
  - ▶ One child policy in the cities help families focus on their children's education.
