One year after graduation CCB completers earned approximately \$10,000 more than graduates who earned an associate's degree in a similar program.(2)



In 2022-23, more than 15,505 baccalaureate degrees were awarded by community colleges.(1)

On average, CCB students are over 30 years of age and choose to attend a community college close to home so they can work full-time, care for family, and play an active role in their communities.(2)

Half of all CCB-conferring colleges are Minority-Serving Institutions. 76% of these colleges are designated as Hispanic-Serving Institutions. We also estimate 20 Tribal Colleges authorize bachelor's degrees. (3)
