


National Landscape of Community College Baccalaureate

24 States allow community colleges to grant baccalaureate degrees


At least 17 of those require the demonstration of a workforce need for program approval

Impact of CCB Degrees




Community College System

Community College Baccalaureate Programs Must Have:

Documentation of unmet workforce need

AND

Narrative supporting the necessity for a 4-year degree for the program


Documentation must include

- Evidence of consultation with regional employers and regional workforce development boards.
- Statewide and regional workforce data relevant to the proposed CCB.
- baccalaureate degree to be offered will help address unmet workforce needs.

Why we revised required Labor Market Information (LMI)?





Inconsistent LMI evidence

Inaccurate LMI reported

Burden on colleges to document evidence

Limited evidence of regional consultation



Changes to ensure:

Application consistency for evaluation

Program viability and sustainability

Workforce relevance



Leading to outcomes:

That prepare students for higher wage jobs

Meet workforce needs

Revising Evidence of Workforce Need:

Labor Market Assessment

Prior Version

- Evidence of labor market need may include a variety of sources:
 - COE labor market assessment report
 - Statistical projections of growth in specific jobs by local area from the State Employment Development Department Labor Market Information system
 - Recent employer surveys
 - Industry studies
 - Regional economic studies
 - Job advertisements for positions in the college's service area
 - Studies or data from licensing agencies or professional associations
 - Newspaper or magazine articles on industry or employment trends





Revising Evidence of Workforce Need:

Labor Market Assessment

Revised Version

- Evidence of labor market need must include:
 - COE labor market assessment report conducted specifically for the proposed program





Revised Labor Market Assessment Report Components

Certification Letter from COE Director

 Certification that labor market assessment was conducted specifically for the proposed baccalaureate degree program.





Revised Labor Market Assessment Report Components

State Data Analysis

- Summarize **educational requirements, licensing and certifications** for associated entry-level occupations.
- Detail typical required work experience.
- Assess if **proposed degree aligns** with educational requirements for target occupations.
- Provide evidence of employer preference for baccalaureate degree holders.
- Provide evidence of higher salaries for baccalaureate degree holders.
- Describe statewide 10-year and annual job openings outlook.





Revised Labor Market Assessment Report Components

Regional Data Analysis

- Analyze historical regional employment trends.
- Describe projected **regional 10-year and annual average job openings.** (Demand)
- Historical and projected annual average graduates from similar programs. (Supply)
- Determine if entry-level wages make a living wage. (Earnings)

Revising Evidence of Workforce Need:

Regional Consultation

Prior Version

- Applicant can submit additional support that may include:
 - Letters of support from employers.
 - Minutes of industry advisory committee meetings.
 - Letters of support from workforce development boards.
 - Regional consortia recommendations.





Revising Evidence of Workforce Need:

Regional Consultation


Revised Version

- Applicants must provide the following evidence of regional consultation:
 - Summary of discussions with employer advisory OR results of an employer survey.
 - Summary of discussions with regional workforce development boards.
 - Regional consortia review/recommendation documentation.






Labor Market Research Process

California CCB Program Expansion by 2030

Goal: 200 CCBs at more than half the colleges

- Develop labor market reports on promising local baccalaureate degree programs for college consideration
- Coordinate with regional employers and regional workforce development boards
- Reach out to colleges without CCBs or outside of a 25-mile radius of a public California university


